The panel discussion will be moderated by **Professor Steven Schwartz, Vice Chancellor & President, Macquarie University.**

Renowned China expert **Orville Schell** is the Arthur Ross Director of the Asia Society Center on U.S.-China Relations. The author of fourteen books, nine of them on China, Orville was the Dean of the Graduate School of Journalism at the University of California, Berkeley for 11 years and is a frequent contributor to such publications as The New York Review of Books, Time, Foreign Affairs, The New Yorker and Harper's.

The Asia Society Center on U.S.-China Relations has recently established the Initiative on U.S.-China Co-Operation on Energy and Climate (U.S.-China Climate Change Initiative), focused on climate change and the use of coal in each country. The Initiative's core Working Group—which consists of the Asia Society, The Brookings Institution, Environmental Defense, The Council on Foreign Relations, The National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, and the Pew Center on Global Climate Change—will be assisted in its efforts by a Task Force whose members will be drawn from the sciences, business, civil society, academe and government as well as by Chinese partners to produce recommendations for joint action to be delivered during the winter of 2009 to both the new U.S. administration and Chinese leaders.

Kevin Hobgood-Brown is a Partner in the Sydney office of the law firm Deacons and is the Chairman of the Australia-China Business Council. Kevin has lived and worked in China several times since 1983, and was a lecturer at Beijing University Law Faculty in the early 1980's. He regularly travels between the U.S., Australia and China. Kevin is a member of the steering committee of the Attorney General's China Working Group, in connection with Australia's free trade agreement discussions with China and is a board member of the Australia China Council of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.
